

Health and Wellness Fair Logistical Information for Participating Organizations

Thank you for registering as an organizational participant in the Veterans Health and Wellness Fair. This is the first event of this kind sponsored by 22 Saves Hockey Foundation and we are happy to be able to provide this for our community of veterans. It takes the support and involvement of all kinds of community organizations – nonprofit, for profit, and governmental agencies - to work together to support our veterans as they manage their health and wellness. Below is some logistical information that I hope will answer most, if not all, of your questions about this event.

Location

The Veterans H&W Fair will take place outdoors at E. Carroll Joyner Park Amphitheater area.

Weather

The weather prediction as of now is that it will be sunny to mostly sunny, but cold. The temperature for the day is expected to be between 46 and 53 degrees, so please dress accordingly!

Arrival Time

Please plan to arrive at the park no earlier than 10:45AM and hopefully no later than 11:00AM. The H&W Fair is scheduled from 11:00AM – 1:30PM. If you are set up by 11:15AM that should be sufficient. You will be allowed to use a narrow hard surface greenway to drive to the area to offload your canopy, table, and supplies.

Please note: We are also hosting a 5K event that begins at 10:00AM and need to minimize vehicular traffic as runners finish up their race. 22 Saves Hockey staff and volunteers will be on site to help direct you to parking and the Amphitheater area. Staff and volunteers will be wearing a yellow or orange reflective vest and a name tag.

Parking

After offloading your equipment and supplies, you will be directed to the overflow parking lot, which is the lot furthest from the community center but closest to the Amphitheater.

*There are two main entrances to the park from Harris Road. If you are coming in from the direction of Capital Boulevard, traveling east on Harris Road, go past the first entrance and enter the second entrance on your right where you will see an “A” frame sign for “Event Parking.” If you are coming in from the direction of Route 1A (Main Street) traveling west on Harris Road, it will be the first entrance that you come to on your left.



Parking is free and just a short distance to restrooms and the location of the H&W Fair event.

Restrooms

Separate male and female indoor restroom facilities are located near the parking lot and event location.

Check-In

Organizations can check-in with Tammy, the H&W Fair Event Manager; or Deb, the Event Director, at the 22 Saves Hockey Tent. You will be shown your designated space to set up.

Setting Up

Organizations should bring their own canopy, table, and chairs. **Ground stakes are not allowed to secure canopies!** Joyner Park will levy fines for staking your canopy. Any other method may be used to secure your canopy. Winds should not be strong on Saturday, so it is not anticipated that sand bags or other weights will be necessary.

First Aid

We will have a Physician Assistant, an EMT, and a nurse on site in the event medical assistance or first aid is needed. The First Aid tent will be adjacent to the 22 Saves Hockey tent.

Coffee and Other Refreshments

We plan to keep a fresh supply of coffee, water, and snacks on hand.
